
It's been a busy month of May! In addition to all the usual activities we've had

Some of the questions students asked:

Is there actually a winner in war?
Why does God let war happen in the first place?
As Christians should we be involved in war - if so why or why not?
What is the relevance of 'old victories'?
How does a war 80 years ago apply to us?
How does Jesus death that happened 2000 years ago apply to us today?

Praise the Lord for the opportunity to help the students to grapple with some tough questions and think about what the Bible has to say.

Special appeal

The Exam Survival kits we have given out this year to students cost £1.25 per kit. The booklets we offer to primary school students, with quizzes, advice and Bible verses to help them on their journey to secondary school, cost £1.50 each. Could you help us with this work?

We are delighted this year to have doubled the number of year 6 students we are visiting, from nearly 200 students to just under 400 students, to share the story of Daniel, to talk to students about their hopes and fears for the future, and to introduce them to the hope we

have in Jesus, and to the Christian Unions they will find waiting for them in secondary school. But unlike our Christmas and Easter lessons, these lessons carry the extra cost of these lovely booklets.

£15 would buy 10 year 6 books for us to give away - or 12 Exam relief packs for older students

£45 buys a class set of books - or 36 exam packs.
